Re: Submission for opposing a Reintegration Facility at 473 Puaiti Road

I oppose the establishment of this facility for the following reasons.

It imposes an activity in an area that for the past 80 years has been a proudly rural community and is zoned as such to allow the peaceful uninterrupted continuation of activities associated with such a zone to continue to do so as per RLC zoning laws.

An activity such as a re-integration facility will have devastating consequences, creating fear and anxiety amongst a lot of people in the community who are used to going about routines and not having to worry about their property or themselves, family and neighbours being safe. A fear some would say is unfounded; however, it is well documented across the motu of various crimes, some violent being committed by those on parole or on bale, example of which are

- The recent case of a Christchurch women raped and murdered by (un-beknown to her) a person on parole living next door who had served time for multiple violent assaults on women.
- The Beverly Bouma home invasion/murder that was committed in 1999 in the nearby rural area of Reporoa is still raw in the local community's mind.

In 2016 I personaly experienced the trauma of having 2 absconders, on some sort of experience course from the youth justice facility based on SH30 near Horohoro passing over our whenua, whereby police and corrections staff were actively trying to apprehend them both. (resulting in them handing themselves in or being caught). One can only imagine what the outcome might have been if they were adult paroles or prisoners such as those taking part in the Tikanga Aroro Charitable Trust programme.

It must also be noted that from time to time participants undertaking the Tikanga Aroro Trust programme will have people visiting them, other than staff and family members etc, whom would not be required to go through rigorous security checks on site such as those who visit a corrections type facility, potentially bringing in contraband of various description that would have a negative outcome/affect on participants and community alike and these potential visitors will be of a character that has no respect for property and people alike, and could venture on to someone's property un-invited and if approached may lash out in a more than likely violent manner causing incalculable harm and trauma to an innocent victim. I.e. Coming onto a property asking for fuel, then being told no!
