Submission Opposing Resource Consent to establish and operate a reintegration housing activity in Waikite Valley (Rural Zone 1A)

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to formally oppose the granting of a resource consent permitting the establishment and operation of a reintegration housing activity on a rural-zoned property in Waikite Valley. I respectfully request that this submission be given due consideration under the relevant provisions of the District Plan, particularly those governing activities within the Rural 1A zone.

#### 1. Incompatibility with Rural Zoning (Rural 1A)

The proposed development is a non-complying activity under the District Plan and is fundamentally at odds with the intended purpose of the Rural 1A zone, which is to protect and support rural production activities, lifestyle blocks, and other activities that are compatible with the rural environment. The establishment of a facility of this nature is neither rural in nature nor compatible with the zoning's intention to preserve productive land and rural amenity.

Allowing this activity within the Rural 1A zone undermines the integrity of the District Plan and sets a dangerous precedent for similar non-complying developments in the future, leading to cumulative adverse effects and erosion of rural values and land use patterns.

#### 2. Adverse Community Impacts

The proposal brings only adverse effects to the existing community. Waikite Valley has been a productive and peaceful rural area for over 100 years, built upon values of safety, collaboration, and agricultural development. The community has successfully developed and maintained schools, community halls, sporting events, a hot pools facility, a golf course, and a network of generational farming businesses. These initiatives reflect a strong, connected, and proactive community dedicated to rural living and mutual support.

Introducing a facility of this nature threatens to destabilize this social fabric. Concerns include:

- Personal safety of residents, particularly children and elderly/ retirees.
- Reduction in property values, deterring future investment in the area.
- Difficulty attracting and retaining skilled staff to local farms and businesses.
- . Disruption of rural tranquility, with the facility likely operating in isolation from community life.
- Zero contribution to the ongoing and historic community-driven projects that define Waikite Valley's identity.

## 3. Inadequate Infrastructure

The proposed location lacks the essential infrastructure required to safely and effectively support this activity:

- No local hospital, with emergency services at least an hour away.
- No permanent ambulance station, police station, or fire service in the immediate vicinity.
- Emergency response times will be inadequate in the event of incidents requiring urgent intervention.

Such an operation cannot realistically mitigate these effects, and placing the facility in this remote location represents a significant and unjustified risk to the wellbeing of the surrounding community.

### 4. Loss of Rural Amenity and Character

The intensive use of the site for a non-rural activities will irrevocably alter the rural amenity and visual character of Waikite Valley. The facility's design, function, traffic volumes, and associated activity levels are inconsistent with the landscape and lifestyle expectations of the area.

The visual impact, security infrastructure (fences, lighting, signage), and increase in traffic will all contribute to the degradation of the natural and pastoral aesthetic that defines the valley and attracts families and rural enterprises to the region.

#### 5. Precedent and Future Implications

Approving this consent sets a concerning precedent for similar non-complying uses in other rural areas. If such a facility can be permitted in Waikite Valley despite clear conflicts with the District Plan, it opens the door to further erosion of rural zoning protections. This risks a gradual urbanisation and

My family and I have lived and worked in Waikite Valley for twenty years, Sharemilking from 1995 to farm ownership in 1999 until we sold in 2015. For the reasons outlined above—namely incompatibility with zoning, adverse impacts on community wellbeing and safety, insufficient infrastructure, degradation of rural character, and the risk of setting an inappropriate precedent—I strongly oppose the granting of this resource consent.

I urge the consenting authority to uphold the integrity of the District Plan, protect the rural character and productivity of Waikite Valley, and deny the proposed application.
