

Support the application. A Maori-based, holistic framework that Tikanga Aroro is underpinned by, is essential for effective rehabilitation as it addresses the social, spiritual, and cultural disconnection that often underpins offending. Sir Mason Duries' research highlights when Maori are supported in a way that recognises their whakapapa, cultural strengths, and community ties, they are more likely to engage meaningfully in their rehabilitation journey. Reinforcing the need for culturally grounded programmes that empower and restore individuals. These approaches foster a sense of purpose, identity, and belonging, key protective factors that significantly reduce the likelihood of reoffending delivering longterm benefits for Rotorua.
