

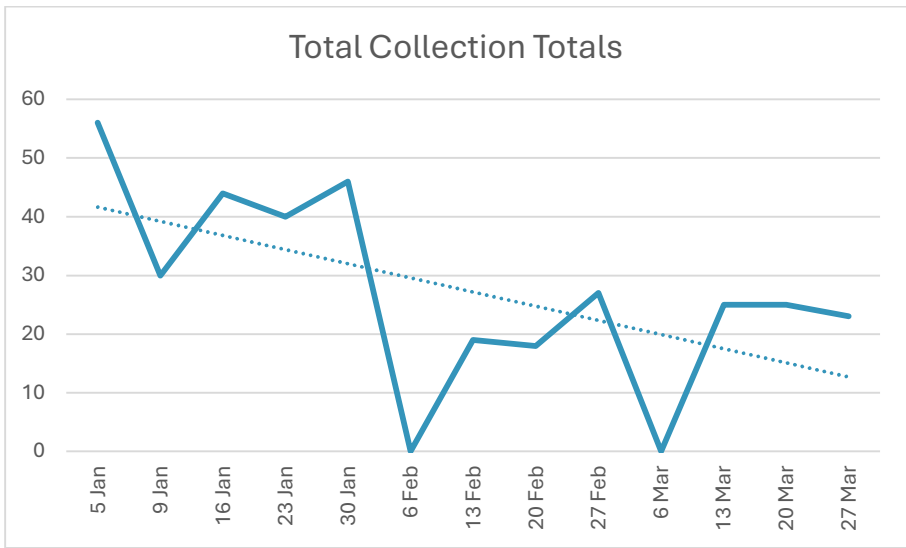
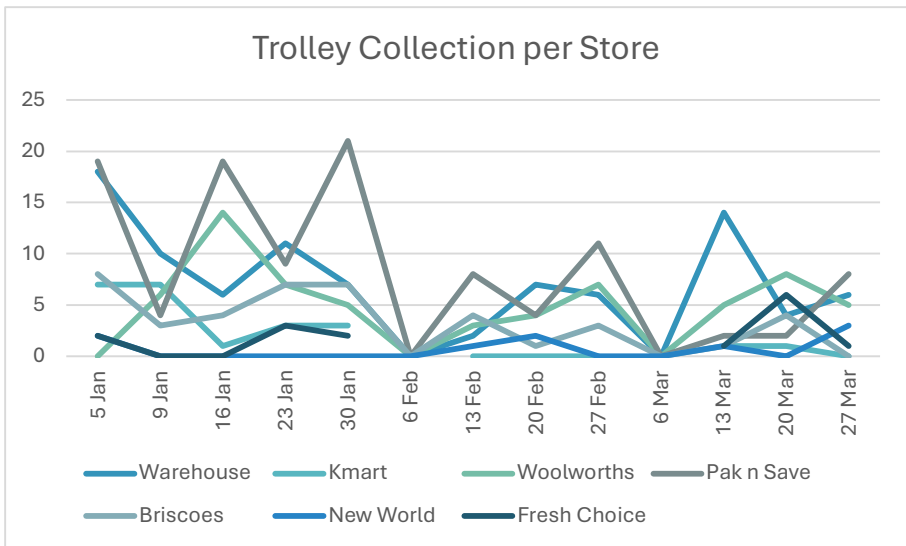
TROLLEY COLLECTION

The Shopping Trolley Bylaw (October 2025) established a coordinated collection and cost-recovery process to reduce abandoned trolleys, including twice-weekly council collection, a central holding facility for retailer retrieval, and charges for trolleys not collected in a timely manner to promote shared responsibility.

Analysis

The number of trolleys requiring collection continues to decline, with an average of 27 trolleys collected per week, down from 32 per week in the previous quarter.

- Pak’nSave and The Warehouse continue to account for the highest number of trolleys collected, reflecting the scale of these businesses, their larger trolley fleets, and higher customer volumes.
- Nearly all retailers are promptly uplifting their trolleys from the central collection point; however, Briscoes and Kmart did incur charges this quarter.
