

## Safety Risk Guide

## 1. Safety Risk Category

A Contractor's generic safety risk level will fall into one of three categories:

- 1. High risk (includes tendered work)
- 2. Moderate risk Work that is not minor
- 3. Low Risk Minor work or consultancy

These categories align with the Council Procurement Policy.

The value of the potential contract is not a consideration when evaluating safety risk as we are interested in the risk of harm, regardless of contract value.

If the contract falls into the moderate or high safety risk category, then Council H&S Prequalification is required before a contract is approved. Pre-qualification can apply to all procurement categories (type 1, 2 or 3) as pre-qualification is required for all work that is safety risk assessed as moderate or high, which can be in any of the procurement types.

As general guidance:

- Suppliers are usually low risk.
- Physical work is usually moderate or high risk, depending on the nature of the work.



## 2. Contractor Safety Risk Classifications

The table that follows provides guidance by way of indicative examples to assist you in determining the safety risk.

Safety Risk Rating	Examples	Requirements

	Painting where no at height work will take place and only acrylic paint used
