This site is fenced and appears to be ungrazed by domestic stock.

Risk Assessment:

Unknown

Significance Level:

Local (Appendix 4 - Table 1 - Criteria 1, 8, 10, 11, 12; Table 2 - Factor L1).

Significance Justification:

This site is locally significant because it is a small area of indigenous forest on a land type (undulating with knolls) that is under-represented in the existing

reserve system in the Rotorua Lakes ED.

Fieldwork Required:

No fieldwork required to assess significance, but fieldwork required to

update biodiversity and management information.

Notes:

In 1996, permission was not obtained to enter this site and it was inspected from the road. In 1998 maps were generated based on that inspection and

using aerial photographs.

This site was identified as a "Recommended Area for Protection" (RAP





No. 13) in the natural area survey of Rotorua Lakes ED (Beadel et al. 1998).
