were dominated by pasture species.

This site is heavily grazed, although the landowner is keen to see the area

fenced to exclude grazing.

Risk Assessment: If grazing is still occurring by stock: Risk to site - high; Timeframe - high.

Significance Level: Local (Appendix 4 - Table 1 - Criteria 1, 8, 9, 11, 12; Table 2 - Factor L1).

Significance Justification:

This site is of local significance as it is an example of indigenous forest on undulating to hilly landform. This site is a small example of a healthy

indigenous forest typical of the character of Rotorua Lakes Ecological

District.
